

Alaska Gear and Equipment List

Your equipment must be packed in a duffle bag or backpack, due to limited space in the airplane. It is also imperative that you remember to PACK LIGHT, your bag must not weigh over 50 pounds. Be sure to think in OUNCES with all gear and equipment, not pounds. Synthetic fibers used in layers have largely taken over hunting clothing. Lightweight, with the ability to “wick” out moisture, and quick drying when wet are some of the major advantages - remember that “Cotton Kills”.

Sleeping Bag (Synthetic - no down) (Hunts in September will need warmer bags)

Therm-a-rest Mattress (or equal)

1 full-sized backpack external or internal frame (Approximately 5000 cu. in.)

2 pair of thermal underwear (Polypro or Under Armor)

6 - 8 pair quality socks

2 pair hunting pants / shirts (Cabela's Microtex or Woll for Late Season)

2 short sleeved T-shirts

1 long sleeved fleece shirt or pullover

1 raincoat and pants (good quality – Mountain Hardware/Cabela's MT050)

1 pair of gaiters (Outdoor Research Crocodiles)

1 set of scope covers

Warm gloves and hat

1 pair of camp shoes

1 pair of well broken in, tough waterproof leather hiking boots (Mendl Alaskan Hunter of Lowe)

1 pair of packable light weight waders (Wiggy's @ wiggys.com)

1 medium to heavy jacket with hood (down or synthetic)

1 vest (down or Polarfleece)

1 pair of sunglasses and Sunscreen

2 Water bottles (one Liter) or hydration system

2 boxes of ammo

1 pair of binoculars

Camera

Small flashlight or headlamp (Petzl)

1 dozen Zip Lock bags (assorted sizes)

Collapsible Walking Stick

Lightweight Towel
